# Who is Elizabeth Alloway?

The wife of Winnipeg Foundation founder William Forbes Alloway, Elizabeth Alloway was a community-minded leader and philanthropist in her own stead. She hailed from a lumber baron's family in Ontario and made a substantial life with W.F. Alloway in Winnipeg.

She was committed to bettering the city by supporting a variety of charities during her lifetime, with monetary gifts, and with her time volunteering for social agencies that improved our community.

William and Elizabeth Alloway lived on Assiniboine Avenue - just a short stroll from Dalnavert and their friend Sir Hugh John MacDonald. When Alloway created The Winnipeg Foundation in 1921, Sir Hugh served on its first Board of Directors.

When Elizabeth Alloway passed away in 1926, the bulk of her estate was left in a bequest to The Winnipeg Foundation - at the time, it was the largest bequest made in western Canada, and it set the stage for a century of community support made through bequests, to The Foundation. Elizabeth Alloway was a trailblazer in her time and by leaving a gift through her Will was The Winnipeg Foundation's first Legacy Circle member.



## What is Dalnavert?

The Dalnavert Museum was built in 1895 on Treaty 1 land and was home to former Manitoba Premier, Police Magistrate, lawyer and Winnipeg Foundation Board Member Sir Hugh John Macdonald, and his family.

After his passing, Dalnavert became a boarding and rooming house. The grounds were to be converted into a parking lot until the Manitoba Historical Society (MHS) together with several historical activists purchased the house.

In 2013, The MHS closed the doors of the Museum spurring a group of dedicated and passionate individuals to create Friends of Dalnavert Museum Inc. This newly formed not-for-profit organization assumed ownership and was able to re-open Dalnavert Museum in the spring of 2015.

Today, Dalnavert Museum and Visitors' Centre is a cultural hub, event centre, and along with interpreting the history of the house and early Winnipeg, is the host to educational and entertainment programs.
