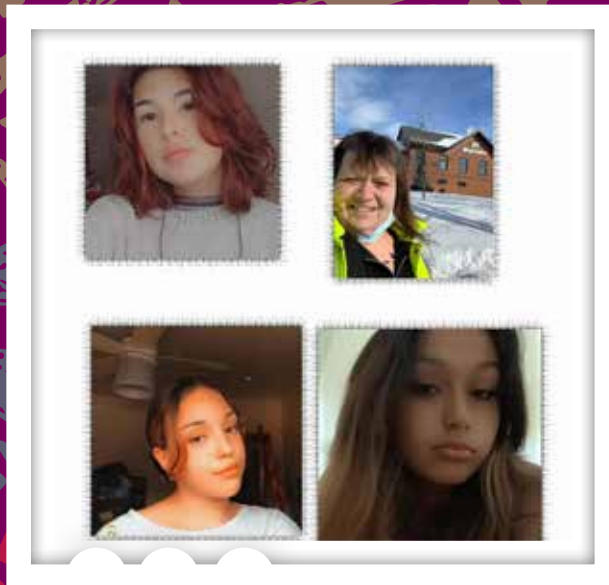

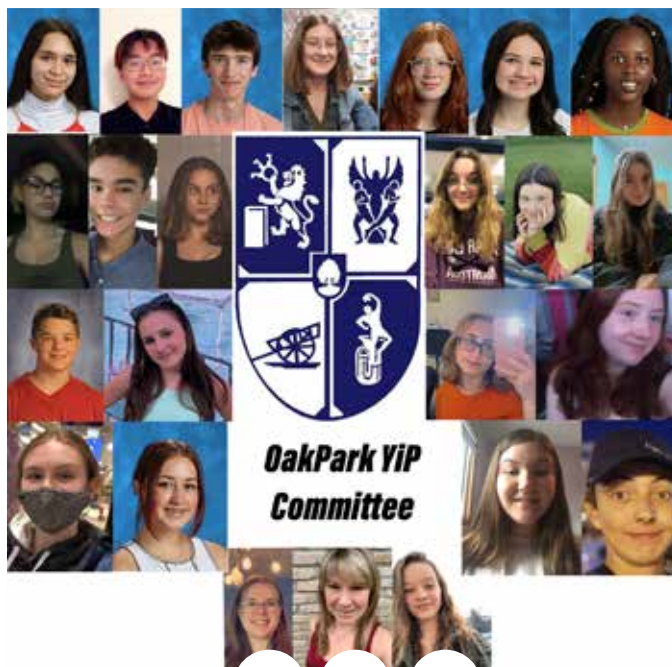

About YiP

The Winnipeg Foundation's Youth in Philanthropy (YiP) program is made possible thanks to the generosity of donors from all walks of life who make gifts through The Foundation. YiP was established in 1999 to introduce local high school students to philanthropy and community development. The program provides hands-on experience that benefits participating students and local charities alike. It also brings valuable new perspectives to The Foundation's grant-making, while empowering youth as decisionmakers and leaders. This year, more than 300 students representing 21 high schools and three community organizations allocated \$139,000 in grants to local charities based on each committee's chosen Cause. During the past 23 years, The Winnipeg Foundation's youth programming has granted over \$2 million into the community.
